

# apt errors

## apt key error

When apt-get update shows the following error with only debian repositories:

```
W: There is no public key available for the following key IDs:
```

The simple fix is to install the debian-archive-keyring package and repeat the update process

```
apt-get install debian-archive-keyring  
apt-get update
```

For google chrome repository and error:

```
W: There is no public key available for the following key IDs:  
1397BC53640DB551
```

The fix is to:

```
wget -q -O - https://dl.google.com/linux/linux_signing_key.pub | sudo apt-key add -
```

For other NO\_PUBKEY errors, make a note of the ID, then use

```
sudo apt-key adv --keyserver keyserver.ubuntu.com --recv-keys KEY
```

## not configured yet


In case of dpkg dependency errors of a package that isn't configured yet, trigger configuration manually. Example error:

```
dpkg: dependency problems prevent processing triggers for  
libglib2.0-0:i386:  
 libglib2.0-0:i386 depends on libc6 (>= 2.28); however:  
  Package libc6:i386 is not configured yet.
```

```
sudo dpkg --configure -a
```
